Outline

- I. The "bottom line" of your job isn't simply an economic one. It's worship of God and service to others (2 Cor. 5:9-10; Matt. 22:36-40)
- II. Don't clock out of worship when you clock in to work. Worship and work go hand in hand (Romans 12:1; Colossians 3:17,23; 1 Cor. 10:31)
- III. Don't downplay the "common grace" of God you can show to others in what do at work! (James 1:17; Matt. 5:45; Gal. 6:10; 1 Thess. 5:15; Luke 6:35-36)

Sermon Discussion:

I. Conversation Starter Questions

- A. Tell your occupation and brainstorm as a group who all is affected by what you do.
- B. What do we mean when we use the word WORSHIP outside of a church service?
- C. What do we mean by secular and sacred? What's Common Grace?

II. Application Questions

- A. Do you clock out of worship when you clock in to work? If so, what can you do to repent and worship in your work?
- B. What aspect of your job has never crossed your mind to do for the glory of God? Going forward, how will you strive to think differently?
- C. How does your vocation uniquely allow you to show common grace, and work for the common good of others?
- D. How do you view the people you work with? Do you treat them with courtesy and respect, or just put up with them because you have to?
- E. How can you pray for your boss and those you work with? How might praying change the way you view others?

III. Gospel Connection - It always comes back to Jesus!

- A. What do you see the Lord is calling you to put into practice as an expression of worship at your work?
