What are the missing pieces to our parenting puzzle that will make ours uniquely "Christian?"

1. Fear-based / Defensive Parenting

The uniquely Christian aspect of our parenting is not all about how much we can protect our kids from outside influences.

2. Behavior Tactics & Fixes

It's important, and helpful, and a blessing to have well-behaved kids... but there's nothing uniquely Christian about well-behaved children. The world's got them, too.

The battle for our children is not primarily fought on the outside. It's a matter of the heart.

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Christian parenting is all about "the baton pass."

Deut. 6:6,7 "And these words which I command you today shall be in your heart. You shall teach them

diligently to your children..."

Deut. 11:19 "You shall teach them diligently to your children,

speaking of them when you sit in your house, when you walk by the way, when you lie down,

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and when you rise up."

Psa. 78:4 "... but tell to the coming generation the glorious

deeds of the LORD, and his might, and the

wonders he has done."

Christian parenting must be Gospel-powered or it is <u>not</u> uniquely Christian.

How we view God determines how we parent our children. Gospel-powered parenting is a commitment to parent my children in the way God parents me.

Heb. 4:15

"For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but one who in every way was tempted as we are, yet without sin."
