You're That Guy Luke 15:11-19

Luke 15:11-19 "And He said, 'There was a man who had two sons. And the younger of them said to his father, "Father, give me the share of property that is coming to me." And he divided his property between them. Not many days later, the younger son gathered all he had and took a journey into a far country, and there he squandered his property in reckless living. And when he had spent everything, a severe famine arose in that country, and he began to be in need. So he went and hired himself out to one of the citizens of that country, who sent him into his fields to feed pigs. And he was longing to be fed with the pods that the pigs ate, and no one gave him anything. But when he came to himself, he said, "How many of my father's hired servants have more than enough bread, but I perish here with hunger! I will arise and go to my father, and I will say to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son. Treat me as one of your hired servants."""

Reader: This is the Word of The Lord. Response: Thanks Be To God!

I. You're missing the point if you don't see the prodigal son as symbolic of you.

Luke 15:12 "And the younger of them said to his father, 'Father, give me the share of property that is coming to me.'"

- A. God doesn't distinguish between sins like we do.
 - 1 John 5:17 "All wrongdoing is sin..."
 - 1 John 3:4 "Everyone who makes a practice of sinning also practices lawlessness; sin is lawlessness."

Romans 3:21-23 "But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it— the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction: for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God."

- James 2:10 "For whoever keeps the whole law but fails in one point has become guilty of all of it."
- B. Before you were saved, whether walking or running, you were headed to "a far country."
 - **Luke 15:13** "Not many days later, the younger son gathered all he had and took a journey into a far country, and there he squandered his property in reckless living."
 - Isaiah 53:6 "All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned—every one—to his own way..."
 - 1 Peter 2:25 "For you were straying like sheep..."

II. You're missing the point if you don't know that you were headed for certain, inescapable death apart from Christ.

Luke 15:16 "And he was longing to be fed with the pods that the pigs ate, and no one gave him anything."

Romans 6:23 "For the wages of sin is death..."

James 1:14-15 "But each person is tempted when he is lured and enticed by his own desire. Then desire when it has conceived gives birth to sin, and sin when it is fully grown brings forth death."

Ephesians 2:1-3 "And **you were dead** in the trespasses and sins **in which you once walked**, following the course of this world, following the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work in the sons of disobedience— **among whom we all once lived** in the passions of our flesh, carrying out the desires of the body and the mind, **and were by nature children of wrath, like the rest of mankind**."

III. You're missing the point if you don't know it was solely by God's grace that you came to Christ!

Luke 15:17-18 "But when he came to himself, he said, 'How many of my father's hired servants have more than enough bread, but I perish here with hunger! I will arise and go to my father...'"

Ephesians 2:4-5 "But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which He loved us, even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved."

Titus 3:5-6 "He saved us, **not because of works done by us** in righteousness, but according to **His own mercy**, by the washing of regeneration and renewal **of the Holy Spirit**, whom **He poured out on us** richly through Jesus Christ our Savior."

John 1:12-13 "But to all who did receive Him, who believed in His name, He gave the right to become children of God, who were born, not of blood nor of the will of the flesh nor of the will of man, but of God."

Questions for Personal Reflection and/or Community Group Discussion:

- 1) Why is it so easy for us to read parables and teachings of Jesus and think of how they apply to others before applying it to ourselves?
- 2) How do you feel about the fact that God doesn't distinguish between sins like we tend to?
- 3) Pastor Peter said "If you don't realize the younger son is symbolic of you, you won't love sinners like Jesus did." Why is that true?
- 4) Why is it important to understand that, regardless of the circumstances surrounding your life when you were saved, you were like the younger brother and were in "a far country"?
- 5) Why do you think the Scriptures repeatedly remind us that our salvation is God's doing and not our own?
