# Growing Down Into Greatness

Luke 22:24-34

**Luke 22:24-34** "A dispute also arose among them, as to which of them was to be regarded as the greatest. <sup>25</sup> And He said to them, 'The kings of the Gentiles exercise lordship over them, and those in authority over them are called benefactors. <sup>26</sup> But not so with you. Rather, let the greatest among you become as the youngest, and the leader as one who serves. <sup>27</sup> For who is the greater, one who reclines at table or one who serves? Is it not the one who reclines at table? But I am among you as the one who serves. <sup>28</sup> You are those who have stayed with Me in My trials, <sup>29</sup> and I assign to you, as My Father assigned to Me, a kingdom, <sup>30</sup> that you may eat and drink at My table in My kingdom and sit on thrones judging the twelve tribes of Israel. <sup>31</sup> Simon, Simon, behold, Satan demanded to have you, that he might sift you like wheat, <sup>32</sup> but I have prayed for you that your faith may not fail. And when you have turned again, strengthen your brothers.' <sup>33</sup> Peter said to Him, 'Lord, I am ready to go with You both to prison and to death.' <sup>34</sup> Jesus said, 'I tell you, Peter, the rooster will not crow this day, until you deny three times that you know Me.'"

Reader: This is the Word of The Lord. Response: Thanks Be To God!

#### Jesus descended into greatness, and so should you!

**Luke 22:25-26** "And He said to them, 'The kings of the Gentiles exercise lordship over them, and those in authority over them are called benefactors. <sup>26</sup> **But not so with you.** Rather, let the greatest among you become as the youngest, **and the leader as one who serves.**"

- A. Godly leaders lead differently than worldly leaders.
  - a. Pastors are to shepherd the flock, not drive the herd.
    - **1 Peter 5:3** "...**not domineering over those in your charge**, but being examples to the flock."
  - b. Husbands should sacrificially love, not selfishly subjugate.

**Ephesians 5:25** "Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and **gave Himself up** for her..."

c. Fathers should bring up their children, not put them down.

**Ephesians 6:4** "Fathers, do not provoke your children to anger, but bring them up in the discipline and instruction of the Lord."

d. Christians should be winsome, not worldly.

**2 Timothy 2:24-26** "And the Lord's servant must not be quarrelsome but **kind to everyone**, able to teach, patiently enduring evil, <sup>25</sup> **correcting his opponents with gentleness**. God may perhaps grant them repentance leading to a knowledge of the truth, <sup>26</sup> and they may come to their senses and escape from the snare of the devil, after being captured by him to do his will."

## II. Jesus persevered through trials, and so can you!

**Luke 22:28-30** "You are those who have stayed with Me in My trials, <sup>29</sup> and I assign to you, as My Father assigned to Me, a kingdom, <sup>30</sup> that you may eat and drink at My table in My kingdom and sit on thrones judging the twelve tribes of Israel."

**Hebrews 10:35-36** "Therefore do not throw away your confidence, which has a great reward. <sup>36</sup> For you have need of endurance, **so that when you have done the will of God you may receive what is promised**."

#### III. Jesus wasn't done with Peter, and He's not done with you!

**Luke 22:31-34** "'Simon, Simon, behold, Satan demanded to have you, that he might sift you like wheat, <sup>32</sup> but I have prayed for you that your faith may not fail. And when you have turned again, strengthen your brothers.' <sup>33</sup> Peter said to Him, 'Lord, I am ready to go with You both to prison and to death.' <sup>34</sup> Jesus said, 'I tell you, Peter, the rooster will not crow this day, until you deny three times that you know Me.'"
