## Ephesians 5:1-2

**Ephesians 4:31-5:2** "Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice. <sup>32</sup> Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you. <sup>5:1</sup> Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children. <sup>2</sup> And walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave Himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God."

Reader: This is the Word of The Lord. Response: **Thanks Be To God!** 

I. You need to know God's command is grounded in His own example!

**Ephesians 5:1-2** "Therefore **be imitators of God**, as beloved children. <sup>2</sup> And walk in love, **as Christ loved us** and gave Himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God."

A. Humility isn't just required of us. It was modeled for us.

**John 13:14-15** "If I then, your Lord and Teacher, have washed your feet, you also ought to wash one another's feet. <sup>15</sup> **For I have given you an example**, that you also should do just as I have done to you."

B. Love isn't just demanded of us. It was modeled for us.

**1 John 4:10-11** "In this is love, not that we have loved God but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins. <sup>11</sup> Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another."

C. Forgiveness isn't just expected of us. It was modeled for us.

Ephesians 4:32 "Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you."

II. You have no right to withhold forgiveness from anyone – because Christ didn't withhold it from you.

**Ephesians 5:1** "Therefore **be imitators of God**, as beloved children."

- A. You need to remember how much you have been forgiven.
  - a. We not only sin—we're also skilled at justifying it, minimizing it, or not even recognizing it.

**Jeremih 17:9** "The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately sick; who can understand it?"

b. David acknowledges there are sins in him that he doesn't even know about.

Psalm 19:12 "Who can discern his errors? Declare me innocent from hidden faults."

- c. Paul knows that a clear conscience doesn't mean a clean record.
  - **1 Corinthians 4:4** "For I am not aware of anything against myself, but I am not thereby acquitted. It is the Lord who judges me."
- d. Jesus paid it all!

**Colossians 2:13-14** "And you, who were dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, God made alive together with Him, **having forgiven us all our trespasses**, <sup>14</sup> by canceling the record of debt that stood against us with its legal demands. This He set aside, nailing it to the cross."

B. You have been shown mercy-so you must show mercy.

**Luke 6:36** "Be merciful, even as your Father is merciful."

C. Forgiveness is the clearest evidence of God's love in you.

Colossians 3:12-13 "Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, <sup>13</sup> bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive."

Forgiven people forgive people.

III. You need to walk in love by giving, not getting – just as Christ gave Himself for you.

**Ephesians 5:2** "And walk in love, **as Christ loved us and gave Himself up for us**, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God."

A. Walking in love will cost you, but not as much as it cost Jesus.

**Hebrews 12:3-4** "Consider Him who endured from sinners such hostility against Himself, so that you may not grow weary or fainthearted. <sup>4</sup> In your struggle against sin you have not yet resisted to the point of shedding your blood."

Romans 5:8 "But God shows His love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us..."

B. Christ's love and obedience pleased the Father–and yours does, too.

**John 14:23** "Jesus answered him, 'If anyone loves Me, he will keep My word, and My Father will love him, and We will come to him and make Our home with him.'"

**John 15:10-11** "If you keep My commandments, you will abide in My love, just as I have kept My Father's commandments and abide in His love. <sup>11</sup> These things I have spoken to you, that My joy may be in you, and that your joy may be full."

## Questions for Personal Reflection and/or Community Group Discussion:

1. Pastor Peter said "Jesus never says, 'Do as I say, not as I do.'" How does seeing Christ's example make obedience seem more possible?

- 2. How does the statement "You have no right to withhold forgiveness from anyone..." challenge you?
- 3. Pastor Peter said "Forgiveness can be declared immediately, but trust is proven over time." Why is it helpful to differentiate between forgiveness and trustworthiness?
- 4. Who do you need to forgive—even if they haven't apologized? Even if you don't trust them?
- 5. How does knowing that your obedience pleases God give you confidence in your daily walk with Him?
