- 5. How do you keep the Gospel "good news," instead of "old news"?
- 6. What did Jesus mean by calling Herod a "fox"?
- 7. What can challenge your confidence that Jesus' mission cannot be thwarted?
- 8. What can you be tempted to put your hope and confidence in besides Jesus?
- 9. Do you consistently see the mercy of God in your life, no matter the circumstances?

10. In the last ten years, how do you see our culture's opinion of what is true being further and further away from what the Bible says?

11. What do you think your closest friends think about the return of Jesus?
