HOW SHOULD I UNDERSTAND SIN?

For each question, look to the Scriptures provided to think through each category and answer the question. Before each question ask God to help you to overcome your own biases and to grasp a biblical understanding of the definition and nature of sin. Think carefully not just about what the answer is, but how you should be aware of it in your own life. Ask God to foster a sense of remorse for sin in your life.
