- B. What's something you're definitely NOT gifted to do?
- C. How have you struggled to understand what the Bible says about gifts?

## **II. Application Questions**

- A. How can you be tempted to define success (\$, status, years to retirement, etc)?
- B. How does pride affect the way you see and use your gifts?
- C. How is your work different if your focus is not being a consumer, but as serving others?
- D. What does it look like to "be set free" to use your gifts for His glory?

## III. Gospel Connection – It always comes back to Jesus!
